COVID Alert

Canada's Exposure Notification App



Overview

- On July 31, 2020, the Government of Canada launched a national mobile app called **COVID Alert**.
- COVID Alert is an **exposure notification app**, and not a contact tracing app.
- It does not use telephones numbers, addresses or known locations to alert individuals.
- It informs users if they have been near a person who later tests positive for COVID-19.
- Here are the main features:
 - Protecting privacy and safety;
 - Nationwide interoperability;
 - User-centric design.
- The app does not replace manual contact tracing and other important tools.



How the app works

- The app uses **Bluetooth** to exchange **random codes** with nearby phones.
- When a user is declared positive, they receive a **unique key** from health authorities.
- The key allows users to upload their phone's random codes to a national server.
- Every day, user phones receive a list of random codes from people who tested positive.
- If the app finds a match, it sends a **notification** to the user.
- The **following steps** are provided by the user's provincial or territorial health authorities.



Protection of personal information and security

- The app integrates the **Apple and Google exposure notification framework (ENF)**.
- The ENF has been selected for privacy protection and effectiveness:
 - Decentralized architecture
 - Privacy-friendly cryptography
 - Low energy Bluetooth
- The app does not collect any information that would allow an individual to be identified or geo-located.
- The Privacy Commissioner of Canada continues to be consulted and supports its use by Canadians.



Rollout

Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Newfoundland and Labrador and Prince Edward Island may distribute a one-time key to people who receive a positive result from COVID-19 screening tests.

Nova Scotia may also distribute one-time keys in the coming days.

The app has been **downloaded** more than **4 million times**.

We continue to focus on the integration of the other provinces and territories.

To take charge of the rollout, an **advisory committee** has been created to ensure that the app meets the highest standards in the following areas: public health, technology, and privacy.



Considerations

- COVID Alert is available to all Canadians.
- The exposure notification systems have proven effective at all levels of user adoption.
- Even though in some locations, people can't yet report a COVID-19 diagnosis through this app, it is still a good idea to download COVID Alert. That way, you will be alerted
 - if you encounter a person from a reporting province or territory;
 - when people in your region are able to report a diagnosis.
- COVID Alert requires an Internet connection once a day to function, and this can be through Wi-Fi or a data plan.
- When connected, it uses a very small amount of data, about the same amount as receiving one email a day.

Awareness

The Government of Canada is also conducting a public awareness campaign to help increase the number of downloads.

- **Additional media plans for each jurisdiction:** publicity is rolled out jurisdiction by jurisdiction in a complementary manner.
- **Digital first:** the emphasis placed on digital platforms guarantees targeted publicity based on geographic location and device type.
- **Amplification through awareness and marketing:** collaborative relationships with a variety of organizations to reach Canadians with different points of contact and networks

What the partners can do

- The more Canadians who use COVID Alert, the more effective the tool will be in limiting the spread of COVID-19.
- Health Canada wants to continue working with partners in an effective and flexible way to reach Canadians as economic activity resumes. This could involve making the app better known and encouraging clients to download it through:
 - messages tailored to clientele;
 - social media posts (exchange of existing content or creation of new content by adapting existing ads);
 - digital communications channels (e.g., bulletins, e-blasts, apps intended for clients);
 - messages spread by employees;
 - additional creative items (posters, digital messaging, stickers for windows or mirrors) placed in high traffic areas.
- There is a bilingual [digital toolkit](#) that includes easy-to-understand resources (infographics, information sheets, posts to share on social media, media lines, digital resources and videos).
- Creative products provide some flexibility to adapt messages to the particular needs of your organization, while still complementing national publicity and awareness activities, already being conducted by Health Canada. A writing guide and worksheets are available on our [FTP site](#).
- The partners must submit all promotional products they are developing to Health Canada to ensure the uniformity of the brand image and appropriate use of federal identifiers.



Notifications are based on having spent more than 15 minutes less than 2 metres from another user in the past 14 days. Your identity is not revealed.</p> | <h3 style="background-color: #8A2BE2; color: white; padding: 5px;">What to do if you may have been exposed</h3> <p>If the app notifies you about potential exposure, you should follow the guidance from your local public health authority.</p> |



Why you should download the app




