I am contacting you on behalf of the Best Medicines Coalition (BMC), a national alliance of 28 patient organizations, together representing millions of patients, with a shared goal of equitable, timely and consistent access for all Canadians to safe and effective medicines that improve patient outcomes. As you can appreciate, the patient communities our member organizations represent have been deeply impacted by COVID-19 and we are closely monitoring progress towards a safe and effective vaccine.

We understand that the National Advisory Committee on Immunization has an integral role in planning for the eventual roll-out of a COVIC-19 vaccine or vaccines, including the important work of identifying which groups or types of individuals should receive priority and early access. We commend the efforts underway by you and your colleagues in considering various aspects,

As this initiative proceeds, we request information regarding the scope and process for your considerations. It would be helpful to have clarity on timelines and next steps, including regarding consultations with experts and stakeholders external to your committee. Specifically, we wish to understand what plans are in place to involve ethicists in your deliberations and whether you have established processes to consult with and involve patients and their representatives in your review.

We look forward to your response to these requests and to learning more about this crucial initiative. We are, of course, available to discuss any of these issues and to offer our perspectives.
