## **Questions Addressed to the Minister of Health:**

There were  $\underline{2}$  questions addressed to the Minister of Health today.

**Michelle Rempel Garner (Calgary Nose Hill - CPC):** Referenced rapid testing and at-home testing in other countries, and inquired about the kind of testing that will be available in Canada.

**Hon. Patty Hajdu (Minister of Health**): Replied that the Government has been working diligently in order for Canadians to have access to rapid point of care testing. Testing at home is more complex and it is a challenge everywhere around the world. She noted that the Government would continue to work hard, so that safe and accurate testing is available in Canada. In addition, the federal government is working with industry partners, so that when tools become available the Government is able to ensure quick accessibility for every Canadian.

**Pierre Paul-Hus (Charlesbourg—Haute-Saint-Charles - CPC):** Asked the Government to accelerate access to rapid testing in Canada.

**Hon. Patty Hajdu (Minister of Health)**: Replied that the Government is working to make technology available in Canada. The Government will continue to research new and safe tools in the market to ensure that Canadians have access to safe rapid testing. In addition to the health transfers provided to PTs, the Government has accelerated processes at Health Canada so that when new tools are available they are approved.

# **Questions of Interest to the Health Portfolio:**

There were **<u>4</u>** question of interest to the Health Portfolio today.

Allain Therier (La Prairie - BQ): Asked for Quebec to receive additional health transfer funding.

**Rt. Hon. Justin Trudeau (Prime Minister - LPC)**: Replied that the Government is taking action this week. The Government has provided \$19 Billion to PTs to help fight the pandemic. Since the beginning of the pandemic, the federal government has been there for every province, and the Government promises to help all PTs further. In addition, the Government has spoken to the Premier of Quebec and the federal government will help Quebec every way possible.

**Claude Debellefeuille (Salaberry—Suroît - BQ):** Expressed her solidarity for the people in the regions of Quebec that have had to lockdown, and asked for reoccurring investments in health care by the federal government.

**Hon. Pablo Rodriguez (Honoré-Mercier - LPC):** Replied that the Government has provided \$675 million to increase tests and PPE supplies, and \$270 million for mental health and vulnerable populations. The Government will continue to collaborate and work with the province of Quebec in order to fight the pandemic.

**Niki Ashton (Churchill—Keewatinook Aski - NDP):** Referenced an outbreak at York Factory, a First Nation indigenous community in northern Manitoba, and asked the Government to help indigenous communities deal with COVID-19 outbreak.

**Hon. Marc Miller (Ville-Marie—Le Sud-Ouest—Île-des-Soeurs - LPC):** Expressed the Government's solidarity for the York Factory community and expressed the Government's concerns with the outbreak. The federal government will continue to monitor the situation in the region. The federal government has shipped five shipments of PPEs to the community and has increased additional nurses, with 2 arriving yesterday. The Government is closely working with the government in the region to help deal with the outbreak. The Government will continue to monitor the outbreak in the region.

Luc Thériault (Montcalm - BQ): Referenced the amount of money the Government has transferred to Quebec, and asked the Government to increase health transfers.

**Hon. Pablo Rodriguez (Honoré-Mercier – LPC):** Replied that the Government has been working with Quebec since day one, whether in regular discussions between first ministers or otherwise. The federal government has also provided concrete assistance. Millions of dollars have been provided for testing and \$112 million invested for mental health. He noted that the federal government has always been there for Quebec, since day one, and will remain so.
