COVID-19 MORNING BRIEF OCTOBER 27, 2020

CANADA UPDATE

I. Public Health and Epidemiology

National Case Counts: (as of October 26, 19:00 EDT)

- Total Cases (+ increase since last report):
 - Total of 220,213 (+4,109, including 2,531 yesterday) reported cases (includes both confirmed and probable) among reporting provinces and territories.
 - The increase since yesterday represents a rate of **6.7 new cases per 100,000**.
- Recovered and Active Cases:
 - 184,306 (83.7%) cases have recovered, for a total of 25,934 (+1,205) active cases. ** Additional information on active cases at Annex A
- Deaths:
 - 9,973 (+111, including 27 yesterday) deaths (yesterday: BC-3, AB-7, MB-1, ON-6, QC-10).
- Reproduction Rate:
 - The estimated reproduction rate (Rt) in Canada is **0.96** as of October 26.

Provincial and Territorial (P/T) Case Counts:

- Cases are distributed across 10 provinces and 2 territories (BC, AB, SK, MB, ON, QC, NL, NB, NS, PE, YK, and NT).
- Rate of new cases per 100,000 yesterday:
 - O BC 4.1; AB 11.5; SK 4.6; MB 7.3; ON 5.8; QC 9.5; NL 0.2; NB 0.4; NS 0.1; PE 0.0; YT 4.9; NT 0.0; NU 0.0
- British Columbia reported 207 new cases yesterday (317 new cases on October 24 and 293 cases on October 25); 10,734 cases have recovered, for a total of 2,378 (+327) active cases.
- Alberta reported 504 new cases yesterday (396 new cases on October 24 and 572 cases on October 25); 20,949 cases have recovered, for a total of 4,477 (+826) active cases.
- Ontario reported **851** new cases yesterday; **60,839** cases have recovered, for a total of **7,286** (+166) active cases.
 - According to the province's epidemiological summary, the Greater Toronto
 Area reported 609 new cases for October 25, for a total of approximately
 47,150 cases, 21.4% of the national case count.
- Quebec reported **808** new cases yesterday; **85,822** cases have recovered, for a total of **8,947** (-196) active cases.
 - According to Santé Montréal, the Greater Montreal Area reported 366 new cases on October 25, for a total of approximately 64,877 cases, 29% of the national case count.

National and P/T Testing Overview:

- **9,650,875 (+47,398)** people have been tested for COVID-19 across Canada to date (average of **129,279** per day over the last 7 days).
 - o **2.2%** have tested positive to date.
 - The percentage of positive tests for the week of October 18 to October 24 is **2.0%.**
- Ontario tested **27,715** people; Quebec tested **10,158** people; British Columbia and Alberta did not report tests.

Long-Term Care Facilities:

- Based on P/T websites and press briefings, and not validated by P/Ts, 7,674 of 9,946 (77%) deaths in Canada were linked to LTC facilities as of October 26.
- On October 25, P/Ts reported **19** deaths in LTC facilities (public or privately run). These deaths had the following breakdown:
 - O BC 177 (+3); AB 185 (+6); SK 3 (+0); MB 26 (+1); ON 2,170 (+2); QC 5,072 (+7); NB 3 (+0); NS 57 (+0), NL 0 (+0), PE 0 (+0), YT 0 (+0), NT 0 (+0), NU 0 (+0).

Note: These numbers are subject to fluctuation and reporting lags as P/Ts complete investigations to verify deaths linked to LTC facilities. As such, these numbers cannot be directly compared against the daily numbers of new deaths reported above. Facilities may be privately run or under provincial authority.

Indigenous Communities:

- As of Monday, October 26, 2020:
 - First Nations Communities There are **1254 (+104)** confirmed cases and **15 (+0) deaths** associated with First Nations communities.
 - 877 (+65) cases have recovered, for a total of 362 (+39) active cases.
 - The new cases are in BC (+3), AB (+27), SK (+28), MB (+38) and ON (+8).
 - BC: There are 6 active on reserve cases in British Columbia First Nations.
 - AB: There are 67 active on reserve cases in Alberta First Nations. Four communities now have GeneXpert testing operational: Fox Lake and John D'Or in Little Red River Cree Nation (LRRCN), Siksika Nation and Saddle Lake Cree Nation. This week ISC-AB are supporting community screening and testing services in Bigstone Cree Nation, Maskwacis, Alexander, Alexis, Saddle Lake Cree Nation and Goodfish #128.
 - SK: There are 141 active on reserve cases in Saskatchewan First Nations. Service Advisories in place. Outbreaks have been declared in 8 communities (Ahtahkakoop Cree Nation, Big River, Red Earth, Stanley Mission, Southend, Little Red River, Sturgeon Lake and Red Pheasant). As of October 25 there are 27 schools in SK First Nations communities that have closed temporarily due to COVID exposure.
 - MB: There are 106 active on reserve cases in Manitoba First Nations.
 - **ON**: There are 27 active on reserve cases in Ontario First Nations.
 - QC: There are 15 active on reserve cases in Québec First Nations.

- Atlantic: There are no confirmed cases of COVID 19 in Atlantic First Nation or Inuit communities.
- o Inuit/Northern Communities:
 - There are 28 (+0) cases associated with residents of Inuit communities in **Nunavik** (northern QC), with 23 (+0) recovered and 2 (-3) active.
 - There are 7 active cases in Yukon and 4 in NWT, not necessarily in Indigenous communities (stats are not disaggregated).
 - *Breakdowns based on Indigenous identity are not available in the territories.

Temporary Foreign Workers and Farm Outbreaks:

- As of October 26:
 - There are **2,419 (+0)** reported cases among workers on farms in Canada.
 - o 2,302 (+18) cases reported to have recovered, for a total of 114 (-24) active cases.
 - There are at least **93 (+0)** operations affected, **47 (+1)** of which are reported to no longer have active cases.

II. Communications and Media Coverage

- Domestic coverage of the COVID-19 pandemic is moderate Tuesday morning as reports
 continue to focus on the spread of the virus across Canada. Regional coverage focuses on
 Ontario, Quebec, and Alberta, where daily infections remain comparatively high. In frontpage coverage Tuesday, reports detail the passage of the Conservative Party motion calling
 for a broad study of the GC's handling of the COVID-19 pandemic by the HoC Health
 Committee.
- International sources focused on growing protests in parts of Italy and Spain as more
 restrictions are implemented to curb a rise of infections, while WHO Director General
 Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus warned against pandemic fatigue and called on the world to
 not give up. US sources noted the continuing rise of cases in many states as the US election
 is just over a week away.

Government of Canada Public Communications – October 27, 2020

• **PM Trudeau (PCO)** to announce the launch of the Rapid Housing Initiative. Ottawa, ON (11:30). PM to make announcement at noon day presser, together with Minister Hussen and Minister LeBlanc. DCPHO Dr. Howard Njoo will also be present. Open coverage. Accompanying NR announces the \$1-billion Rapid Housing Initiative to create up to 3,000 new permanent, affordable housing units across the country.

- Min. Bibeau (AAFC) Virtual event and news release announcing the Emergency On-Farm Support Fund for BC. The investment of \$4.9M under the Emergency On-Farm Support Fund will help British Columbian farmers better protect the health and safety of farm workers during the COVID-19 outbreak. The Investment Agriculture Foundation of British Columbia (IAF) will deliver the program on behalf of the federal and provincial governments.
- (HC) Canada's COVID-19 Immunity Task Force (CITF) NR to announce \$1.9M to fund a new Canadian Partnership for Tomorrow's Health (CanPath) study looking at COVID-19 seroprevalence across Canada, with a focus on populations traditionally not included in studies or that are among the highest risk of exposure (e.g., underserved communities and residents of long-term care homes).

III. U.S. UPDATE

Case Counts:

- As of 6:00am on October 27, Johns Hopkins is reporting 8,704,606 (+67,611) cases of COVID-19, including 225,735 (+505) deaths.
 - As of October 26, the CDC is reporting that the number of tests performed by commercial, hospital, public health, and CDC laboratories is 140,718,258 (average of 1,100,662 per day over the last 7 days).
 - o **7%** have tested positive to date.

IV. GLOBAL UPDATE

Case Counts:

As of 6:00am on October 27, Johns Hopkins is reporting 43,539,290 (+495,604) confirmed cases of COVID-19, including 1,160,213 (+5,690) deaths. The U.S. is reporting the highest numbers of cases, followed by India, Brazil, Russia, France, Argentina, Spain, and Colombia.



Figure 2. Daily Number of Reported New COVID-19 Cases in Canada over the Last Fourteen Days as of October 26, 2020






Figure 3. Daily Total Count of Reported COVID-19 Active Cases in Canada over the Last Fourteen Days as of October 26, 2020

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Figure 4. Daily Number of Reported New COVID-19 Deaths in Canada over the Last Fourteen Days as of October 26, 2020






Figure 5. COVID-19 Cases (n= 166,047) in Canada, by date of illness onset and exposure category as of October 26, 2020






Figure 7. Effective Reproductive Number Estimate for Canada

Figure 8. Status of COVID-19 Cases in Toronto




