Please see attached the DR for October 20.

News bullets:

- The Canada-U.S. border closure agreement was set to expire on Oct. 21, but the Canadian government announced on Monday that the closure will be extended until at least Nov. 21. Prime Minister Trudeau said Canada plans to keep the border closed as long as COVID-19 case counts in the U.S. remain high.
- Alberta and Saskatchewan reported record numbers of active cases on Monday. The number of active cases of COVID-19 in Alberta has reached 3,138, the highest ever reported in the province. The province reported 898

new cases and four deaths over the weekend (Friday, Saturday and Sunday). For the third day in a row, Saskatchewan set a record high with 398 active cases on Monday. Saskatchewan also reported 66 new cases of COVID-19, the highest-ever single-day increase in the province.

- Weekly test positivity has increased to 3.1%, compared to 2.8% in the previous week.
