MEDICAL DEVICES

As of May 5, Health Canada has authorized a total of 137 medical devices under the Interim order.

- 17 test kits
- 120 non-diagnostic devices (non-IVDD devices):
 - o 7 N95 masks
 - o 38 surgical masks
 - o 33 face shields
 - 4 ventilators
 - o 6 gloves
 - 4 sterilizers
 - 28 Others (thermometers, airway management, beds, swabs, isolation kits, ventilator accessories, AI for diagnosis, test reagents, monitors, software, sterilizer solution, glucose monitoring, Spirometer, Bipap, CPAP helmets, infusion pumps and a thermal camera).

As of May 5, Health Canada has authorized:

- 60 disinfectants and 1,799 hand sanitizers via a Canadian licence (DIN or NPN); and
- 338 products (including both disinfectants and hand sanitizers) under the Interim Order.*

*Products authorized under the interim order are all **imported** products that will not receive a license; it is not possible to easily separate imported and domestic products obtaining licences

INTERIM ORDER ON DRUG AND MEDICAL DEVICE SHORTAGES (imports):

- As of <u>May 5</u>, Health Canada has added 36 total medical devices to the List of Medical Devices for Exceptional Import and Sale under the Interim Order.¹
 - Ventilator: 1
 - o Masks: 24
 - N95 respirator: 2
 - Gowns (including apron, sleeve, protective suit): 7
 - o Face shield: 1
 - o Gloves: 1
- As of <u>May 5</u>, Health Canada has added a total of 15 drugs to the List of Drugs for Exceptional Import and Sale under the Interim Order.²

MEDICAL DEVICE ESTABLISHMENT LICENCES (MDELs)

- As of <u>May 5</u>, total MDELs issued under the interim order: 831
- Total applications rejected based on lack of critical information required to ensure effective oversight of the activity being licensed: **172**.
 - These companies receive an email indicating that the application was incomplete and have been provided with a link to guidance on how to apply.
- Total MDEL applications remaining in the queue: 40
- MDEL amendments to be processed: 140

¹ Once added to the list, importers with medical device establishment licenses are permitted to import the products after notifying Health Canada 5 days in advance.

² Companies with a drug establishment license may import drugs on the *List of Drugs for Exceptional Import and Sale* after notifying Health Canada 5 days in advance of importation.
