#### **KEY MESSAGING**

- This is not the time to close the door on partnership and collaboration in fighting
   COVID 19 – it is the time to ensure we have the environment to work closer together.
- The U.S. is not immune to the impact of a disruption – you rely on Canada for personnel, critical components, materials, and finished products.

#### People

 Anywhere from 1,500 to 2,000 health care workers live in Windsor and commute to Detroit every day – and many others cross from Quebec to work in Upstate New York

- Canada exported <u>C\$6.6 billion in medical</u> <u>supplies elated to fighting COVID-19 to the U.S.</u> <u>in 2019 – including test kits and medical</u> <u>devices</u> (see details below)
- Canadian provid critical inputs and finished products to the US market
  - Quebec based Medicom, a global manufacturer of PPE products (manufacturing gloves, gowns, N-95 respirators and face masks for the medical community) helping offset the effects of an export ban China instituted amid its fight with the new Covid-19.
  - BC-based Vanrx, has a number of orders from a number of customers in the US for pharmaceutical filling machines to support the development of Covid-19 vaccines and treatments.
- Like the US, Canada's manufacturers have stepped up to retool and manufacture medical equipment such as ventilators and other critical products
  - Magna International Inc., Linamar Corp. and Martinrea International Inc have retooled to manufacturer thousands of ventilators.
  - Linamar, Magna and ABC have all won a contract to supply GM with parts needed to build ventilators in their American operations. <u>They would be</u> <u>manufactured in Canada and then sent</u> to the US to support their needs

 Ontario's Fellfab, traditionally manufacturering fabrics for use in aircraft and trains is producing critical medial products such as medical masks, gowns, tents-shelters & mattress covers

# Research

- Canada and US are investing millions to fight the virus, with incredible results.
- Advancements made by researchers in both our countries, such as the breakthrough at Sunnybrook hospital in Toronto, will be integral to overcoming this global challenge.
- VBI Vaccines Inc., a commercial-stage biopharmaceutical company in Toronto is developing next-generation infectious disease and immuno-oncology vaccines, to develop a pan-coronavirus vaccine candidate, targeting COVID-19, severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS), and Middle East respiratory syndrome (MERS).
