Hi friends – I have some supplies Qs re Chase's story last night which says we shipped 16 tonnes of medical equipment to China in Feb.

- Do you know how much came from the GoC stockpile vs. the Red Cross? Story says the shipment came from both sources
- Was this part of a broader donation that a whole bunch of countries were participating in?
- Have we ordered more than 16 tonnes of equipment for P/Ts?
- And are the donations we've received from Chinese companies significant since the outbreak began in Canada?

Also, I pulled the statement that was quoted from the Globe story + PSPC & ISED lines on domestic capacity into the bullets below.

Is this still factually correct & is there anything we can add, more so on the domestic production capacity / procurement side, to make this stronger?

- Our number one priority is keeping Canadians safe and our economy strong
- We are in daily communication with provinces and territories with respect to needs, and we are working around the clock to identify and order ADDITIONAL supplies for them
- Deliveries of protective equipment and medical supplies are underway and we continue to make new orders with the view of being over-prepared
- We have also introduced new measures to directly support businesses so they can rapidly scale up domestic production or re-tool their manufacturing lines to develop even more products here in Canada
- This pandemic knows no borders, and global co-operation is vital to slowing the spread of COVID-19 which will protect the health and safety of people around the world, including here in Canada
- Canada will continue to work to ensure that we have the equipment we need to fight this virus and that our partners do, too
- We stand ready to take further action to support provinces, territories, frontline workers and all Canadians

If pressed:

- In early February, when the spread of COVID-19 was primarily limited to China, Canada facilitated sending equipment through the Canadian Red Cross to the Red Cross Society of China
- As more Canadians have become affected by the spread of this virus, we have welcomed donations from Chinese companies, including CTrip
