Tier 1 - COVID-19 - Defense Production Act

CONTEXT (for your information):

The senior writer is preparing an article on whether Canada should follow the U.S. lead by invoking its Defense Production Act, compelling manufacturers to begin making ventilators to combat COVID-19. He indicates the Prime Minister said March 19, 2020, it was a possibility Canada would invoke its Defense Production Act, permitting PSPC Minister Anand to compel companies to help manufacture medical needed material to combat the spread of COVID-19.

With respect to the *Defence Production Act*, this only applies the military defence of Canada. Unlike the *Defense Production Act* in the United States, our *Act* does not provide powers over industry and sources of supply in times of national emergency.
