I just got off the phone with Mark Entwistle, formerly Canada's Ambassador to Cuba and now a managing partner with Acasta Capital in Toronto.

He is eager to discuss a UK company called Medical Device Training International (MDTI). They are in the process of having a novel ventilator design fast-tracked through the regulatory process in the UK for possible mass manufacturing to deal with the pandemic.
