Many of my constituents who work in the private sector, especially those in the retail and manufacturing industries, are wondering how they will manage in a reopening economy to get the personal protective equipment that they will need to work safely. For these companies, the challenge is significant, especially considering that there is no centralized distribution network as there is in the health care system.

I recognize that the government has just announced the creation of a council that will look into the issue of procurement.

Can the minister explain the role of this council? Could she tell us what we plan to do to support Canadian companies in reopening the economy? Is consideration being given to supplying the private sector directly from the federal government, at least in part?
