Readiness criteria and indicators - General Observations

1

COVID-19 transmission is controlled

- COVID-19 cases have occurred in nearly every province/territory
- National trends reflect a series of regional epidemics
 - QC and ON account for over 81% of new cases at the national level over the past month
 - No community transmission in NWT and YK
- Canada's effective reproductive value (R_t) is trending close to 1
 - Fluctuations at and above 1 in the last month reflect outbreaks in some communities and settings across the country, especially in Western and Central Canada in recent weeks

2

Sufficient public health capacity is in place to test, trace and isolate all cases

- Nationally, Canada's rate of testing remains high
- The 0.8% positivity is the lowest recorded since before the week of March 16

3

Expanded health care capacity exists: new cases maintained at a level the health system can manage including substantial clinical care capacity for surges¹

- Strain on COVID-19 ICU bed resources has decreased by 89% since mid-April, and the share of ventilators occupied by COVID-19 patients has also decreased
- Given current ventilator utilization rates across the provinces and the increase in ventilator supply, a shortage of ventilators is not anticipated

4

Supports are in place for vulnerable groups/communities and key populations to minimize outbreak risks

- Outbreak investigations help to identify risk factors for enhanced transmission, e.g., close congregate living in long term care facilities or temporary housing
- 81% of deaths are linked to long-term care and seniors' homes

5

Workplace preventive measures are established to reduce risk

- Outbreaks in other congregate living and work settings are also driving case counts

6

Avoiding risk of importation of cases

- Strong border measures have reduced transmission risk from international sources
- Travel-related cases down dramatically since March
- The proportion of imported cases has been significantly reduced since the implementation of public health measures at the border

1. ICU bed capacity may be defined differently across provinces and territories (e.g., surge capacity may not always be included or may be defined differently; pediatric and neonatal beds may be included) and timing and completeness of P/Ts reporting may be irregular.
