Anita Anand: Before I begin, I would like to send a big thank you to conquer covid-19 and Haley wickenheiser who have been distributing personal equipment, stepping up for communities and donating what you have on hand is extremely helpful. It's the Canadian way and compliments our government's efforts to purchase vital supplies for our healthcare workers. We are operating in a hypercompetitive global environment and results in complex and sometimes unpredictable supply chains. But we are making progress which I will discuss today. (Speaking French)

I can tell you that this is truly a team Canada approach to procurement with all hands on deck and all of the government working together. Furthermore, I will be think speaking with my counterparts tomorrow. In a market characterized by high demand, we are buying existing inventory where we can and placing large orders to create and to maintain a steady stream of goods flowing from diverse sources over the coming months. (Speaking French).

Our officials are working closely with partners on the ground which includes empathy

and logistic experts to get these supplies into Canada. In particular, we are working with the logistics Canada based on of Montreal and with deloit Canada for receiving, storing services and custom's clearances. Cargo jet and air Canada have stepped up, as well, to bring home to Canada federal orders, as well as provintial and territorial borders. And we continue to work with other officials in China including our formidable ambassador Dominick vartan to navigate the complex campaign chain environment. The. (Speaking French).

I want to thank all of those involved for getting the vital supplies into the country and into the hands of our doctors, our nurses and our healthcare professionals. When needed and asfast as humanly possible. In addition to our international buying efforts, Canadian companies have responded en masse to our suppliers and buy and sell. Through this call to action, we have signed contracts with suppliers like geometric energy corporation based in Calgary and this company will provide millions of nital gloves for Canada's healthcare workers. (Speaking French).

Over the past few weeks, we have also heard about the many Canadian companies that are ramping up production with some manufacturers completely shifting their production lines. Thinking of Canadian companies like Bauer in Quebec that have gone from making hockey gear to making face shields for front-line medical workers or stanfields that is set to provide us with 100,000 medical gowns. (Speaking French). I am very happy to announce that we can add another name to that growing list. The government of Canada has signed a contract with Irving oil which has retooled parts of its production line for much-needed sanitizer. Production will start being delivered over the next few weeks. The gouvernement of Canada has signed a contract with Irving oil which produces much needed sand sanitizer and Irving will start delivering in the next few weeks. This is a part of more than 20 million liters of hand sanitizer that we've order the, ordered.these companies and many others serve as great examples of the ingenuity that will get us through these orders.

We have chartered six flights and we expect four more in the next week carrying a variety of goods from China, including n95 masks. These flights are, of course, in addition to goods that arrive by other means. As of today, we have ordered just under 300 million surgical masks and approximately 145 million and 95 respirators. Today we, have Received deliveries of more than 17 million surgical masks and roughly 800,000 n95 masks were delivered to the provinces and territories last week and we expect 1.1 million to reach them this week. (Speaking French).

We've ordered 100,000 pairs of glasses and more than 14 million have arrived in Canada. Up to 30,000 ventilators with Cea and starfish, and all three are Canadian companies that will be manufacturing these life-saving machines right here at home. These are only some of the supplies that we have on the way and a handful of the Canadian companies that are rising to the challenge. We are operating in a hypercompetitive market and while demand for these supplies is going up, Canada and Canadians are keeping up. Thank you so much.
