Let me know if this helps. Here are some key points, some explanatory notes below and the document behind the data. Notably, all percentages are based on the spend (not # of contracts or items of PPE). Also, on your question about the ramp up pre-covid to now, you'll see from the data below that the GoC acquired only \$3M of PPE on behalf of PHAC in the past ten years. So the starting point was effectively zero.
