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> Let me know if this helps. Here are some key points, some explanatory notes below and the document behind the
data. Notably, all percentages are based on the spend (not # of contracts or items of PPE). Also, on your question about
the ramp up pre-covid to now, you'll see from the data below that the GoC acquired only \$3M of PPE on behalf of PHAC
in the past ten years. So the starting point was effectively zero.

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> * Canadians are now manufacturing all categories of Personal Protective Equipment, except for gloves, along with
supplies for the health sector, such as hand-sanitizer, testing supplies and ventilators.

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> * Since March, we have secured more than 2 billion articles of various personal protective equipment, and we will
continue to receive steady, ongoing deliveries into the coming months.

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> * As of September 9, 2020, PSPC has procured nearly \$6 Billion [\$5,716,165,433.99] of PPE and medical supplies on
behalf of PHAC.

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
