Here are ventilator lines, adjust QC lines below:

- Since issuing a call to action to industry partners and the business community, we have worked collaboratively with over 2,900 companies that have stepped up to offer their capacity and expertise;
- This is about Canadian manufacturers making Canadian products to support Canadians on the front lines;
- For example, Guelph, Ontario-based Linamar is bringing together a group of companies to develop safe, effective, and cost-efficient ventilator designs, and to quickly ramp up production of the selected designs.
- Through existing sources of supply, we have already ordered 1570 ventilators. We are working to secure upwards of 4000 additional ventilators, and very possibly more in future.

Good morning,

PSPC lines for PPE shortages, and concerns over faulty supplies:

- The whole-of-government is focused on responding to the COVID-19 outbreak, and working with partners at all levels of government, and with industry, to identify priority items and secure necessary supplies in real time.
- We are partnering with Canadian industry to rapidly scale up and re-tool production capacity, ensuring a reliable domestic supply to serve our needs for the short and long terms.
- We are also deepening the use of existing supply arrangements and innovative, flexible procurement approaches to accelerate Canada's response to the pandemic.
- We stand ready to take further action and adapt our approach as the situation evolves.

If-pressed:

- We recognize that some of these goods are in high demand around the world, and we are leveraging existing sources of supply while also proactively engaging industry to help meet Canada's needs.
- We are investing \$2 billion to purchase ventilators and protective personal equipment, and to support diagnostic testing.
- Our goal is to be over prepared and we are ordering supplies in anticipation of future needs, to ensure they are available for provinces, territories, frontline health workers and Canadians.

If-pressed (faulty supplies):

- We are working with established suppliers and distributors, and we have strong processes in place to ensure that the supplies we receive meet all necessary standards.

If-pressed (Quebec):

- We have placed significant order for PPE and we are working hard to make sure we have that equipment to distribute to Quebec, and every province and territory that needs it, as quickly as possible.
- This is a Canada-wide effort and the Premiers are doing extraordinary work. We are working through every possible channel at all levels of government in order to secure the essential medical supplies that Canada needs. Our goal is to be over prepared and we are ordering supplies in anticipation of future needs.
