Alright!

The company is called Pulmonem, they have apply for HC approval of a COVID-19 therapeutic called PULM-001 and PULM-001 IV. It is a drug to dampen an overly aggressive immune response. The specific name of the "molecule" is called Dapsone.

The lawyer noted that the company feels in limbo with respect to Canadian approvals / the process, although it seems based on the documents provided that things are moving along well in terms of trials and are at the likely stage of needing support for commercialisation.

It feel like it might be an ISED situation, but I am a bit green to some of the technicalities, so any directional advice you can provide would be appreciated by the Minister.
