Apologies for the delay in responding to you.

The Government of Canada is collaborating with provinces and territories on an ongoing basis to identify their needs and purchase required equipment, supplies and services to combat COVID-19.

Public Services and Procurement Canada (PSPC) is taking an aggressive approach to buying—especially when it comes to personal protective equipment for frontline healthcare workers. This includes:

- Ordering ahead in bulk on behalf of provinces and territories
- Supplementing those orders by purchasing everything that is immediately available;
- Ramping up the domestic manufacturing capacity, through the Plan to Mobilize Industry to fight COVID-19, being led by Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada.

This is over and above the efforts provinces and territories are taking to secure their own supply.

- 01. Can you tell me the name of the firm contracted in China for quality control, logistics and the rental of a warehouse in Shanghai?
 - Q2. Also, I've been hearing from lots of small business people who say they can use their own business connections in China to import masks and other PPE. Is the federal government supportive of these individual efforts or are these people making it harder for you to get PPE?
- A1-A2. We are exploring all options for securing the necessary equipment and supplies to fight COVID-19, through both domestic and international supply chains.

By working directly with both new and existing suppliers and manufacturers, mobilizing Canadian industry and ensuring that suppliers have a clear pathway to supply goods and services that may be of use in response to COVID-19, we have placed orders and received millions of PPE supplies including masks, gloves and gowns. This includes engaging suppliers through the more than 22,000 submissions received to our call-out to suppliers at BuyandSell.gc.ca.

With regard to imports from China, the Government of Canada has secured on the ground support, including an agreement with Bolloré Logistics to provide transportation, reception, and storage services. As part of this agreement, Bolloré Logistics provides on-the-ground support in China, including organizing transportation of personal protective equipment purchased by the Government of Canada. This will be an ongoing process as orders are ready to be shipped to Canada.

The Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) has been working directly with provinces and territories to identify their medical supply needs in order to place bulk buy orders. Public Services and Procurement Canada manages the coordinated, consolidated bulk buying in working with both domestic and international suppliers to help meet these needs and ensure that frontline healthcare workers across the country are equipped and protected in the fight against COVID-19. Through the government's new agreement with Amazon, and their delivery partners that include Canada Post

and Purolator, these supplies are distributed to provinces and territories under the oversight of PHAC, as quickly as possible.

The Minister of Public Services and Procurement has also established a Federal-Provincial-Territorial Ministerial Procurement Working Group with her counterparts across the country, to ensure a coordinated approach to purchasing equipment and supplies needed to fight COVID-19 in the global marketplace.
