Good Afternoon,

I want to begin by thanking you and Steve for your engagement with us. In her advocacy role, Simona has been able to raise our profile significantly across various levels of government. Having a direct connection with your Ministry gives us a new opportunity to share the voice of our members and the broader supply chain community.

This email is a request for you to help us understand what may be an internal process.

In August 2019, Supply Chain Canada (SCMA at that time) responded to a "Certification Inquiry" request for information on our organization, membership, training programs, etc. We were, subsequently, invited in the Fall to discuss it further as part of an engagement activity with colleagues from the [Treasury Board Secretariat's Acquired Services and Assets Sector Community Management Office \(ASAS-CMO\)](#) and the Canada School of Public Service. Christian, Simona and I attended a meeting in Ottawa on/about October 3rd to present to this group.

The next communication was in January of this year when we received notice of the Certification Program Working Group RFI. We prepared and submitted our response on February 20, 2020.

We have had no further communication on the next steps and were hoping that you might be able to shed some light on the status of this project.
