On the total PPE shipments — the number is always changing & certain numbers (i.e. 68 ventilators) seem pretty low. But the surgical mask & gowns numbers look good at least. Would maybe use the success stories rather than specific delivery numbers.

Flight Assistance:

We have brought home twenty planes full of supplies, with flights coming in nearly every day this
past week. 17 of the 20 planes included supplies that the Government of QC procured, which we
have helped bring over.

Total PPE shipments to QC as of May 2 from HC:

453,999 N95s 5,131,700 surgical masks 47,600 gowns 1,801,350 pairs of gloves 25,000 face shields 68 Ventilators

Notable companies in QC who we have contracts with to produce supplies for Canadians:

Logistik Gowns:

- We recently signed a new contract with Logistik Unicorp, a manufacturer in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec. They provide Canadians with over 11 million medical gowns.
 - o They already delivered 5, 400 gowns to PHAC last week.

CAE — Domestic Ventilator production based out of Mtl:

- Headquartered in Montréal, Quebec, CAE is a world leader in the production of educational tools that help healthcare professionals deliver safe, high-quality medical care to patients.
- CAE has been working on a prototype respirator for some time, but when the COVID-19 crisis hit, they turned their attention to bringing this product to market.
- To do so, they partnered with the government and used NRC's services.
- This is a brand new respirator that represents new, innovative, Canadian intellectual property.
- Because of their existing capabilities, CAE is not only offering a respirator, but also the
 opportunity to train the people who will use it to save lives.
- During this process, the company expects to create and/or retain approximately 150 jobs.
- They will be producing thousands of ventilators over the coming weeks.

FR - Calko Group (Montreal, QC)

- Calko was founded sixty-two (62) years ago in Montréal.
- This company used to produce medical bandages.
- However, because of COVID-19, it decided to help Canadians by offering washable cloth masks.
- Today, the Calko Group is redoubling its efforts to produce masks, medical gowns and alternative protective clothing in its factories.
- Initially, it had manufacturing power, but did not have access to textiles to produce this gear.
- Calko worked with the Government of Canada.
- As a result of this collaboration, the company obtained Canadian fabric to make medical gowns. The company is able to speed up its production.
